DESCRIPTION

Explore the past and think like an archaeologist! Students will learn how to preserve and describe historical objects, including identifying photographs, and try their hand at archaeology through "excavating" cookies.

Learn about local archaeology by observing the indigenous conical burial mound and discover ways to interpret the past through examining artifacts from the Tinkers' collection.

GENERAL HISTORY TOUR (ALL AGES) (INCLUDED WITH ALL ACTIVITIES)

DESCRIPTION

Learn about Robert Tinker and the Tinker family through a walkthrough of his home: the Tinker Swiss Cottage.

Students will learn about life in the 19th and early 20th centuries and view artifacts from these eras.

A tour in the Cottage typically lasts around 1-1.5 hours depending on the group size & grade level.

PRAIRIE & CREEK STUDY MIDDLE SCHOOL (6TH-8TH)

DESCRIPTION

Observe the Tinker flower and prairie gardens and learn about local ecosystems. Activities include identifying and sketching local plant species and learning ways to preserve our environment.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHERE CAN WE PARK?

There is a parking lot off of Kent Street or street parking along the entrance off of Winnebago Street. Parking is free of charge. Field Trips begin in the Barn, which is the building closest to Winnebago Street.

DO YOU HAVE A SPOT TO HAVE LUNCH?

Yes, but the museum does not provide food or beverages. We encourage guests to bring water bottles with them. There is an opportunity to have your bagged lunch in the gardens free of charge. If you would like to reserve the indoor lunch room option, it will be an additional \$50 for this set up for the 30 minute lunchroom rental.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO ATTEND?

We strive to keep our field trip opportunities affordable for all guests. A full list of ticket prices can be found on our website. For student groups, one adult is admitted free of charge for every 10 students (1:10).

HOW MANY PEOPLE CAN ATTEND IN ONE GROUP?

The museum can accommodate groups of up to 60 students. Groups over that size will need to book two dates or timeframes to visit.

The museum staff and volunteers do not share information with Field Trips about the paranormal aspect of our museum unless specifically requested by educators.
